How to Become a 4-H Volunteer

Step 1: Fill out 4-H Volunteer <u>application</u> and <u>submit</u> to the Gallia County Extension Office.

Step 2: Attend <u>training</u> and have <u>interview</u> with the 4-H Youth Development Educator.

<u>Step 3:</u> Complete a <u>BCI background check</u>. Background checks are required every 4 years as well as additional trainings for specific project areas and child abuse.

Advisors are like 4-H coaches, they help train, mentor and teach a team of youth members through consistent sequential learning experiences. Every 4-H club has one or more club (coaches) advisors who organize, plan, and conduct educational experiences. As a 4-H advisor, you will be serving in one or more of these club advisor roles:

- 1. <u>Organizational Advisor</u>— The "head coach" of the club that serves as the primary contact between the club and the Gallia County Extension Office and gives leadership to managing and organizing club experiences.
- 2. **Project Advisor-** The "assistant coach" that is responsible for teaching knowledge and skills for one or more project areas.
- 3. <u>Activity Advisor</u>— The "team's coordinator" that serves as the leader in organizing club activities (community service, fundraising, trips and tours, promotional activities, recognition programs, family nights and more).
- 4. <u>Cloverbud Advisor</u>-The "team's trainer" that focuses on providing non-competitive experiences that meet the special needs and interests of Cloverbuds.
