





What Do I Do For My 4-H Project Judging 2020?

We are not able to conduct face-to-face 4-H project judging in 2020, due to the many aspects of COVID-19. We are offering a virtual general and small pets project judging via a technology platform called Flipgrid. This social media platform is used by educators nationwide, allowing their students to share video clips, upload pictures and google slides. 4-H is piloting this method for project judging this year in several counties, including Gallia.

Flipgrid allows exhibitors to record directly from a laptop, tablet or smartphone. It also allows for uploading of a digital video recorded with other methods, like iMovie or Spark. Within the Flipgrid program you will find some editing features but please note, we are **NOT** requiring videos to be edited. Your judging will be simply based on the information you provide in your video, not on the quality of the video. However, we have provided a video tip sheet to help ensure the judge can see and hear you properly.

You should plan to simply exhibit your project like you would in person, while answering 5-7 questions, which can be found on each of the flipgrid project sites and viewed in advance. Videos should be about 5 minutes long (there is a maximum record time limit of 10 minutes). You should plan to display your project as you normally would for a face to face judging. This could include: your poster, nutrition portfolio, scrapbook, project product, your small pet, food display, etc. **Remember to include your completed project book as part of your video!** You also have the option of uploading pictures or slides with your video if you choose, these can enhance your video or replace a physical poster display.

Some things to think about as you prepare your project video:

- Be sure to introduction of yourself: First name only, club name, and year in 4-H
- Each topic will require you to discuss activities you completed in your project book and which were your favorites. Be sure to show your project book in the video when answering these questions.
- Topics may ask you to describe what you learned from your project.
- They may ask about the most challenging/difficult part of your project.
- They may ask for you to tell the judge how you will use the skills you learned.
- Be sure to show and explain your project item/display as thoroughly as possible.

There are a few additional **project specific questions** and requirements listed on Flipgrid topic page. You will be able to log in and review all the questions before you make your video submission and we encourage you to do this first. One example of a project specific requirement is that clothing exhibitors should wear their project or include a picture of them wearing their project. Flipgrid has the ability to view your recording, edit it and add photos before submission. Please make sure you are happy with your final product before submission.

Videos must be submitted no later than July 25th by 4:30PM.

4-H Dog Project Members Flipgrid Videos

There will be **NO face-to-face dog show in 2020** as a result of COVID-19 Pandemic. This year dog project members will be asked to submit a video following the same guidelines as the general, cat and pocket pet exhibitors. Dog club members will compete in the Dog Poster contest, as well as the dog club video contest. Those exhibitors signed up for the All About Dogs and You and Your Dog projects will find their topic grid listed under dog projects as well. We encourage exhibitors to introduce their dog and have them as part of the video.

Cats & Pocket Pets

Please follow the same guidelines as the general projects. Submit a short video answering the supplied project questions about your pet. Be sure to include your completed project book, your pet and any poster display, picture or slide you would like to include.

How will my video be Judged?

The judges reviewing the Flipgrid videos will use the criteria that is included in this packet of information. They will be asked to select 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place award winners for each of the project topics they evaluate. They will also be asked to provide feedback and comments which you will receive after the completion of judging. Winners will be announced on our Extension Website, Facebook site and will receive an email invitation to the **Holzer Awards** that will take place on Friday of fair week. Your invitation to these awards will have information about social distancing changes for this event, please be sure to read it carefully. **With exhibitor permission** (and without full names), we would love to include the winning videos on our website, and social media sites. In addition winners will be invited to submit a photo of them with their project to the Ohio 4-H Virtual Project Showcase. Submission will count as State Fair participation for 2020!

We are here to help!

With this information we have provided step by step instructions for logging on and recording your video. We have also included a **YouTube step by step Flipgrid assistance video** and **sample project videos** from Marion, Henry and Wood Counties. These videos offer good and bad examples of video project recordings.

Tech or Internet issues - We understand internet is not always available. Some families may not have access to smart phones, tablets or laptop computers. Some may need a little more one on one help. We are planning to have appointment times available at the Extension Office, where we will have our camera set up and offer scheduled video recording times if you need them! Those will be schedule starting after **July 6**th. HOW TO ACCESS FLIPGRID

- → It is highly recommended that you use **Microsoft Edge or Google Chrome** for the most positive experience with Flipgrid.
- → On mobile devices, download the FREE Flipgrid APP for iOS and Android devices.
- → Options for Videos: You may use Flipgrid to record your video or upload a video from your device.
- * Your video submission will not available for others to see, as it will be hidden until judged. If you win, you maybe asked permission to post your video on our 4-H and Fair Facebook pages for others to view. *You can access your Flipgrid project judging area by using a unique URL provided on the **Flipgrid project list** provide with this information. These project grids are where you will upload your project video.




To UPLOAD A VIDEO ~ FROM YOUR DEVICE

- ♦ After tapping the green plus symbol as shown above, members can import their own custom video:
- ◆ Tap ... next to the record button. Select your video and finish the steps to submit to Flipgrid
- Review your video Trim, rearrange, or add more. Tap the arrow in the bottom right to advance.
- Take a selfie The selfie will be the cover image for your video. Tap the arrow in the bottom right to advance.
- Submit your video- Edit your name, add a title, or attach a link. Then submit!

ADDING AN ATTACHMENT... OPTIONAL

- ♦ Members may add an attachment at the end. Once you get to the Submit your video screen where you will type your name and project title, you may also add additional information under the Link.
- ◆ Utilize Google Slides, Prezi another mainstream cloud-based presentation software to create an e-poster.
 - E-posters may not include more than 12 slides or advancements.
 - May include photos of your project and/or exhibit --including menus or other exhibit components.
- ◆Copy and paste e-poster URL in LINK
- ◆Publish to the customized 4-H project grid.

Tips for recording a GREAT Project Video!

While we are NOT judging projects on video quality, this is a great time to learn and practice new skills for our new very digital lifestyle!

Lighting — Windows are a good source of natural light, but never film your video directly in front of a window, this will backout your subject. Using lamps place in front of but out of camera range, and to either side of your subject, will help provide good lighting without casting harsh shadows.

Background — Be deliberate about your background. Avoid messy or distracting backgrounds. A solid wall makes a great background. You can also hang a large solid sheet or curtain behind your subject. Be sure to avoid areas where others may accidently walk behind you while filming.

Audio — Film in a quite location. It's can easy to overlook or forget about background noises like traffic, birds, dogs barking, others talking or even the wind, but these become very obvious on recordings.

Shaky Footage — It is hard to hold a camera completely steady. Try using a sturdy surface or tripod if available. Once you have your camera set up, try not to move it during recording. Panning around can be distracting. If you need a different view, stop and start your video, you can edit the segments together after filming.

Smart Phone video — Using your smart phone for a project video is perfectly acceptable. Here are a few tips specific for phone video:

- Use the camera on the back of your phone. The front camera is normally of lesser quality.
- Record in landscape mode (Holding your phone horizontally, not vertically).

Camera Presence – How you look and feel when on camera

- Use calm open body language.
- Stand up straight and keep your shoulders back.
- Try not to cross your arms.
- Remember to smile!
- Talk slightly slower and make an effort to enunciate.
- Speak loud and clear but don't shout.
- Use props in your video to demonstrate your project. This will help you focus.
- Practice, Practice! Do a trial run and watch your footage. Identify where you can improve. Have someone else watch your video and make suggestions before you submit it.
- Plan out your video, just like with a speech, write a scrip that has an introduction, a body, and a conclusion.
- Time your video. You want to cover everything you want to say and not feel rushed, but you also don't ramble.
- Be sure to look at the camera, just like you would look at the judge.

Most importantly, have fun, be creative and just be YOU!

E-POSTER DESIGN TIPS

- ☐ When choosing a design background, maintain that same background throughout the slides.
- ☐ Do not pack too much information on one slide.
- ☐ Do not use wild colors and animations they could be a distraction from your message.
- ☐ Use appropriate fonts, colors, and pictures that match your topic continue color scheme throughout.
- ☐ Make sure audience can read your slides.
